

Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of fourth-grade students in South Dakota was 220. This was not significantly different from the average score of 220 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in South Dakota in 2011 (220) was lower than their average score in 2009 (222) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2003 (222).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in South Dakota at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 42 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2003 (44 points).
- The percentage of students in South Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 31 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (33 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2003 (33 percent).
- The percentage of students in South Dakota who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 69 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (70 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2003 (69 percent).



Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 21 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, female students in South Dakota had an average score that was higher than male students by 7 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 22 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (20 points).
