
Public Schools

Overall Results

- In 2013, the average score of eighth-grade students in Milwaukee was 257. This was lower than the average score of 276 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2013 (257) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (254) and was higher than their average score in 2009 (251).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Milwaukee (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 45 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (42 points).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 11 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (10 percent) and was greater than that in 2009 (7 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 44 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (41 percent) and was greater than that in 2009 (37 percent).





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 35 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (27 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 points).
- In 2013, male students in Milwaukee had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 26 points lower than students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2009 (14 points).
