


Overall Results


- In 2011, the average score of fourth-grade students in Cleveland was 193. This was lower than the average score of 211 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Cleveland in 2011 (193) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (194) and in 2003 (195).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Cleveland at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 44 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2003 (44 points).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 8 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (8 percent) and in 2003 (9 percent).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 32 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (34 percent) and in 2003 (35 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (17 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 13 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (8 points).
- In 2011, female students in Cleveland had an average score that was higher than male students by 9 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2011, because reporting standards were not met.
