


Overall Results


- In 2009, the average score of eighth-grade students in DoDEA was 287. This was higher than the average score of 282 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in DoDEA in 2009 (287) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (285) and was higher than their average score in 1996 (274).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in DoDEA at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 42 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1996 (45 points).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (33 percent) and was greater than that in 1996 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in DoDEA who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 79 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (78 percent) and was greater than that in 1996 (64 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2009, the average score in **DoDEA** was

- lower than those in 8 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 25 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 18 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, male students in DoDEA had an average score that was not significantly different from that of female students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (2 points).
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (28 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (16 points).
- Data are not reported for students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2009, because reporting standards were not met.

NOTE: Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages.
