


**Overall Results**


- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in Michigan was 236. This was lower than the average score of 239 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2009 (236) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (238) and was higher than their average score in 1992 (220).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in Michigan at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 40 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1992 (43 points).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (37 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (18 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 78 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (80 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (61 percent).

**Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results**





**Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- In 2009, male students in Michigan had an average score that was not significantly different from that of female students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (5 points).
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 32 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was narrower than that in 1992 (42 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that of White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of poverty, had an average score that was 25 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (24 points).
