


Overall Results


- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in West Virginia was 233. This was lower than the average score of 239 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in West Virginia in 2009 (233) was lower than their average score in 2007 (236) and was higher than their average score in 1992 (215).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in West Virginia at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 35 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1992 (39 points).
- The percentage of students in West Virginia who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 28 percent in 2009. This percentage was smaller than that in 2007 (33 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (12 percent).
- The percentage of students in West Virginia who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 77 percent in 2009. This percentage was smaller than that in 2007 (81 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (52 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2009, the average score in **West Virginia** was

- lower than those in 41 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 6 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 4 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, male students in West Virginia had an average score that was not significantly different from that of female students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (2 points).
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 8 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (15 points).
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2009, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of poverty, had an average score that was 15 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (19 points).

NOTE: Statistical comparisons are calculated on the basis of unrounded scale scores or percentages.
