


Overall Results


- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in Indiana was 243. This was higher than the average score of 239 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Indiana in 2009 (243) was lower than their average score in 2007 (245) and was higher than their average score in 1992 (221).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in Indiana at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 34 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1992 (38 points).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 42 percent in 2009. This percentage was smaller than that in 2007 (46 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (16 percent).
- The percentage of students in Indiana who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 87 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (89 percent) and was greater than that in 1992 (60 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2009, the average score in **Indiana** was

- lower than those in 6 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 24 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 21 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, male students in Indiana had an average score that was not significantly different from that of female students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (3 points).
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (29 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than that of White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of poverty, had an average score that was 18 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (23 points).
