


Overall Results


- In 2009, the average score of eighth-grade students in New Mexico was 270. This was lower than the average score of 282 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in New Mexico in 2009 (270) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (268) and was higher than their average score in 1990 (256).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in New Mexico at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 47 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1990 (45 points).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 20 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (17 percent) and was greater than that in 1990 (10 percent).
- The percentage of students in New Mexico who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 59 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (57 percent) and was greater than that in 1990 (43 percent).

Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2009, the average score in **New Mexico** was

- lower than those in 45 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 2 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 4 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, male students in New Mexico had an average score that was not significantly different from that of female students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1990 (6 points).
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 29 points lower than that of White students. Data are not reported for Black students in 1990, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1990 (24 points).
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of poverty, had an average score that was 24 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1996 (21 points).
