


Overall Results

- In 2009, the average score of fourth-grade students in Michigan was 218. This was not significantly different from the average score of 220 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2009 (218) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (220) and was not significantly different from their average score in 1992 (216).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in Michigan at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 46 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1992 (44 points).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 30 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (32 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1992 (26 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 64 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (66 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1992 (62 percent).


Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results


Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions

- In 2009, the average score in **Michigan** was
- lower than those in 26 states/jurisdictions
 - higher than those in 10 states/jurisdictions
 - not significantly different from those in 15 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2009, female students in Michigan had an average score that was higher than that of male students.
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 31 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1992 (35 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 19 points lower than that of White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 1992, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low income, had an average score that was 24 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (24 points).
