


**Overall Results**

- In 2009, the average score of eighth-grade students in Washington was 267. This was higher than the average score of 262 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Washington in 2009 (267) was not significantly different from their average score in 2007 (265) and was not significantly different from their average score in 1998 (264).
- In 2009, the score gap between students in Washington at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 44 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1998 (43 points).
- The percentage of students in Washington who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 36 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (34 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1998 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Washington who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 78 percent in 2009. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2007 (77 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1998 (76 percent).


**Achievement Level Percentages and Average Score Results**

**Compare the Average Score in 2009 to Other States/Jurisdictions**



In 2009, the average score in **Washington** was

- lower than those in 9 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 20 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 22 states/jurisdictions

**Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- In 2009, female students in Washington had an average score that was higher than that of male students.
- In 2009, Black students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (25 points).
- In 2009, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that of White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (27 points).
- In 2009, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low income, had an average score that was 21 points lower than that of students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (24 points).
