


Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Michigan was 265. This was not significantly different from the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Michigan in 2011 (265) was higher than their average score in 2009 (262) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2002 (265).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Michigan at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 42 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2002 (43 points).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 32 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2002 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Michigan who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 77 percent in 2011. This percentage was greater than that in 2009 (72 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2002 (77 percent).


Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results


Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions

- In 2011, the average score in Michigan (265) was
- lower than those in 18 states/jurisdictions
 - higher than those in 17 states/jurisdictions
 - not significantly different from those in 16 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (28 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 9 points lower than White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2002, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2011, female students in Michigan had an average score that was higher than male students by 11 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 20 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (13 points).
