


Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Wisconsin was 267. This was higher than the average score of 264 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Wisconsin in 2011 (267) was not significantly different from their average score in 2009 (266) and was not significantly different from their average score in 1998 (265).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Wisconsin at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 42 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 1998 (41 points).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (34 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1998 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Wisconsin who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 79 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (78 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 1998 (78 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2011, the average score in **Wisconsin** (267) was

- lower than those in 10 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 20 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 21 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 32 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (35 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (13 points).
- In 2011, female students in Wisconsin had an average score that was higher than male students by 10 points.
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 24 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 1998 (20 points).
