


Overall Results

- In 2011, the average score of eighth-grade students in Nevada was 144. This was lower than the average score of 151 for public school students in the nation.
- The average score for students in Nevada in 2011 (144) was higher than their average score in 2009 (141).
- In 2011, the score gap between students in Nevada at the 75th percentile and students at the 25th percentile was 45 points. This performance gap was not significantly different from that of 2009 (45 points).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 23 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (20 percent).
- The percentage of students in Nevada who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 57 percent in 2011. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2009 (54 percent).


Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

Compare the Average Score in 2011 to Other States/Jurisdictions



In 2011, the average score in Nevada (144) was

- lower than those in 43 states/jurisdictions
- higher than those in 5 states/jurisdictions
- not significantly different from those in 3 states/jurisdictions

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2011, Black students had an average score that was 34 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (26 points).
- In 2011, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (24 points).
- In 2011, male students in Nevada had an average score that was higher than female students by 7 points. This performance gap was wider than that in 2009 (2 points).
- In 2011, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 19 points lower than students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (19 points).
