


Overall Results


- In 2013, the average score of fourth-grade students in Hillsborough County was 243. This was higher than the average score of 235 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Hillsborough County in 2013 (243) was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (243).
- The score gap between higher performing students in Hillsborough County (those at the 75th percentile) and lower performing students (those at the 25th percentile) was 37 points in 2013. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (37 points).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 43 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (43 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 85 percent in 2013. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2011 (86 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2013, Black students had an average score that was 26 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 points).
- In 2013, Hispanic students had an average score that was 16 points lower than White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (14 points).
- In 2013, male students in Hillsborough County had an average score that was not significantly different from female students.
- In 2013, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 25 points lower than students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 points).
