


#### **Overall Results**

- In 2015, the average score of fourth-grade students in Duval County (FL) was 225. This was higher than the average score of 214 for public school students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2015. This percentage was greater than large cities (27 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 73 percent in 2015. This percentage was greater than large cities (59 percent).


# Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results

## Average Scores for District and Large Cities





### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (32 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (29 points).
- In 2015, female students in Duval County (FL) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for male students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 17 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (31 points).
