


### Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of fourth-grade students in Hillsborough County was 230. This was higher than the average score of 214 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Hillsborough County in 2015 (230) was not significantly different from their average score in 2013 (228) and in 2011 (231).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 41 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (40 percent) and in 2011 (44 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 76 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (75 percent) and in 2011 (77 percent).

### Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (24 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (19 points).
- In 2015, female students in Hillsborough County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for male students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (28 points).
