


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Hillsborough County was 261. This was higher than the average score of 257 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Hillsborough County in 2015 (261) was lower than their average score in 2013 (267) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (264).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2015. This percentage was smaller than that in 2013 (35 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2011 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 71 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (77 percent) and in 2011 (75 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (29 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (17 points).
- In 2015, female students in Hillsborough County had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 14 points.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2011 (22 points).
