


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Albuquerque was 251. This was lower than the average score of 257 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Albuquerque in 2015 (251) was lower than their average score in 2013 (256) and was not significantly different from their average score in 2011 (254).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 19 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (23 percent) and in 2011 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 62 percent in 2015. This percentage was smaller than that in 2013 (66 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2011 (64 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2015, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (23 points).
- In 2015, female students in Albuquerque had an average score that was not significantly different from that for male students.
- In 2015, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 points).
