


Overall Results

- In 2015, the average score of eighth-grade students in Cleveland was 240. This was lower than the average score of 257 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Cleveland in 2015 (240) was not significantly different from their average score in 2013 (239) and in 2003 (240).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 11 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (11 percent) and in 2003 (10 percent).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 48 percent in 2015. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (49 percent) and in 2003 (48 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2015, Black students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (12 points).
- In 2015, Hispanic students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2015, female students in Cleveland had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 9 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2015, because reporting standards were not met.
