


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Guilford County (NC) was 240. This was higher than the average score of 232 for public school students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Guilford County (NC) who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 42 percent in 2017. This percentage was greater than large cities (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Guilford County (NC) who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 79 percent in 2017. This percentage was greater than large cities (71 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (30 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (23 points).
- In 2017, male students in Guilford County (NC) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (24 points).
