


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in Shelby County (TN) was 257. This was lower than the average score of 274 for public school students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Shelby County (TN) who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 12 percent in 2017. This percentage was smaller than large cities (27 percent).
- The percentage of students in Shelby County (TN) who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 42 percent in 2017. This percentage was smaller than large cities (61 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 44 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (39 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (29 points).
- In 2017, male students in Shelby County (TN) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (28 points).
