


### Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Milwaukee was 195. This was lower than the average score of 213 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2017 (195) was not significantly different from their average score in 2013 (199) and in 2009 (196).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 15 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (15 percent) and in 2009 (12 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 40 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (42 percent) and in 2009 (39 percent).

### Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (36 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
- In 2017, female students in Milwaukee had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 7 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 33 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
