


**Overall Results**

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in Milwaukee was 245. This was lower than the average score of 258 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2017 (245) was not significantly different from their average score in 2013 (242) and in 2009 (241).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 15 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (13 percent) and in 2009 (12 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 54 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2013 (51 percent) and in 2009 (51 percent).

**Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results**





**Score Gaps for Student Groups**

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (31 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 12 points not significantly different from that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 points).
- In 2017, female students in Milwaukee had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 10 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2009 (17 points).
