


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Dallas was 201. This was lower than the average score of 213 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Dallas in 2017 (201) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (204) and in 2011 (204).
- The percentage of students in Dallas who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 15 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (17 percent) and in 2011 (14 percent).
- The percentage of students in Dallas who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 45 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (47 percent) and in 2011 (46 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 7 points not significantly different from that for Black students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (4 points).
- In 2017, female students in Dallas had an average score that was not significantly different from that for male students.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
