


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of eighth-grade students in Cleveland was 237. This was lower than the average score of 258 for public school students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Cleveland in 2017 (237) was not significantly different from their average score in 2015 (240) and in 2003 (240).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 10 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (11 percent) and in 2003 (10 percent).
- The percentage of students in Cleveland who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 45 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2015 (48 percent) and in 2003 (48 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (12 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 14 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2017, female students in Cleveland had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 12 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch in 2017, because reporting standards were not met.
