


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Denver was 214. This was not significantly different from the average score of 213 for public school students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Denver who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from large cities (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Denver who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 57 percent in 2017. This percentage was not significantly different from large cities (58 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results




