


Overall Results

- In 2017, the average score of fourth-grade students in Shelby County (TN) was 203. This was lower than the average score of 213 for public school students in large cities.
- The percentage of students in Shelby County (TN) who performed at or above the NAEP *Proficient* level was 16 percent in 2017. This percentage was smaller than large cities (28 percent).
- The percentage of students in Shelby County (TN) who performed at or above the NAEP *Basic* level was 45 percent in 2017. This percentage was smaller than large cities (58 percent).

Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2017, Black students had an average score that was 33 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (31 points).
- In 2017, Hispanic students had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from large cities (27 points).
- In 2017, female students in Shelby County (TN) had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 10 points.
- In 2017, students who were eligible for free/reduced-price school lunch, an indicator of low family income, had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than large cities (28 points).
