


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Fresno was 224. This was lower than the average score of 235 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Fresno in 2019 (224) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (221) and was higher than their average score in 2009 (219).
- The percentage of students in Fresno who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 18 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (17 percent) and in 2009 (14 percent).
- The percentage of students in Fresno who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 65 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (60 percent) and was higher than that in 2009 (58 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (24 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 12 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (21 points).
- In 2019, male students in Fresno had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 11 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2009 (28 points).
