


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Albuquerque was 230. This was lower than the average score of 235 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Albuquerque in 2019 (230) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (230) and was lower than their average score in 2011 (235).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 30 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (29 percent) and in 2011 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 69 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (68 percent) and was lower than that in 2011 (76 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2019, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (25 points).
- In 2019, male students in Albuquerque had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 34 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2011 (26 points).
