


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in Duval County (FL) was 274. This was not significantly different from the average score of 274 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Duval County (FL) in 2019 (274) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (275) and in 2015 (275).
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 25 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (24 percent) and in 2015 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 62 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (63 percent) and in 2015 (64 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (21 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 15 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
- In 2019, male students in Duval County (FL) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
