


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Jefferson County was 232. This was not significantly different from the average score of 235 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Jefferson County in 2019 (232) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (233) and in 2009 (233).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 33 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (35 percent) and in 2009 (31 percent).
- The percentage of students in Jefferson County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 71 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (71 percent) and in 2009 (72 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 26 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (27 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 19 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (17 points).
- In 2019, male students in Jefferson County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (29 points).
