


### Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of eighth-grade students in Clark County (NV) was 272. This was lower than the average score of 274 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Clark County (NV) in 2019 (272) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (272).
- The percentage of students in Clark County (NV) who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 24 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (25 percent).
- The percentage of students in Clark County (NV) who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 59 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (59 percent).

### NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results





### Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (39 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 20 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (26 points).
- In 2019, male students in Clark County (NV) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was narrower than that in 2017 (30 points).
