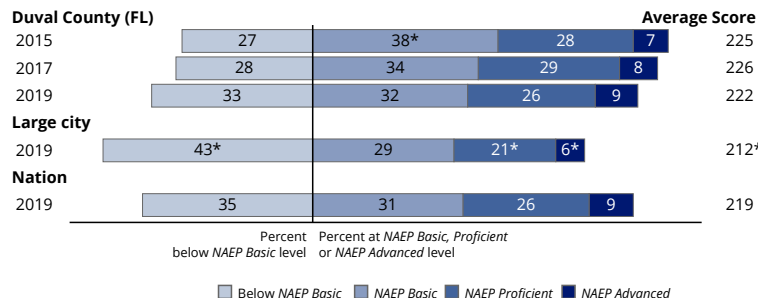


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Duval County (FL) was 222. This was higher than the average score of 212 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Duval County (FL) in 2019 (222) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (226) and in 2015 (225).
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 35 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (38 percent) and in 2015 (35 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County (FL) who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 67 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (72 percent) and in 2015 (73 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



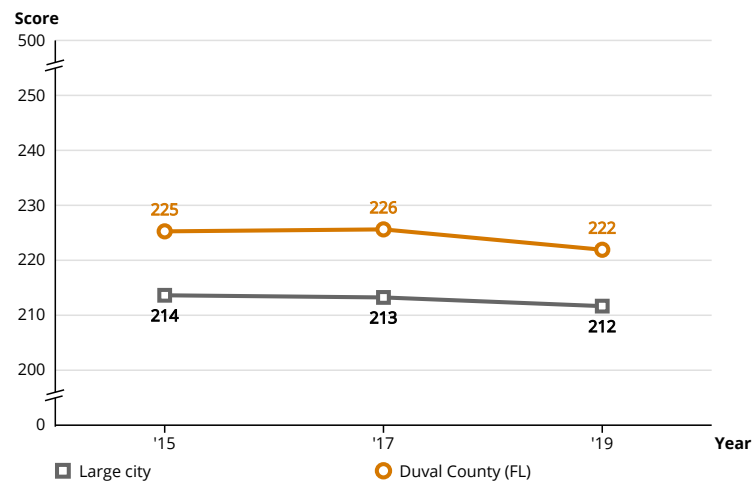

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 24 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (24 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 7 points not significantly different from that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (11 points).
- In 2019, female students in Duval County (FL) had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 9 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 22 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (17 points).
