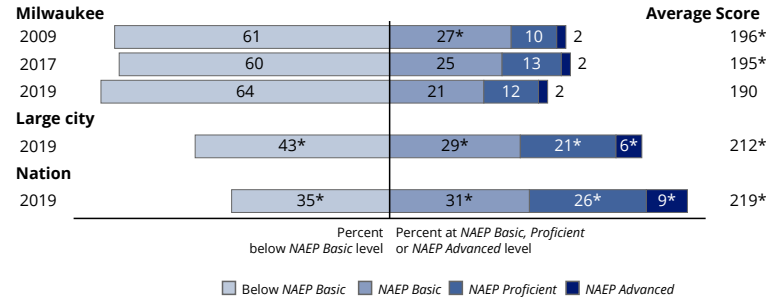


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Milwaukee was 190. This was lower than the average score of 212 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2019 (190) was lower than their average score in 2017 (195) and in 2009 (196).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 14 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (15 percent) and in 2009 (12 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 36 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (40 percent) and in 2009 (39 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



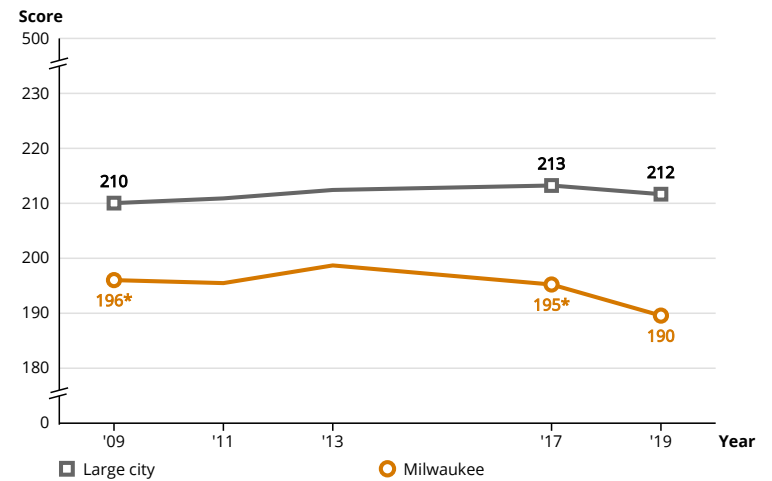

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 41 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (36 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 33 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
- In 2019, female students in Milwaukee had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 15 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
