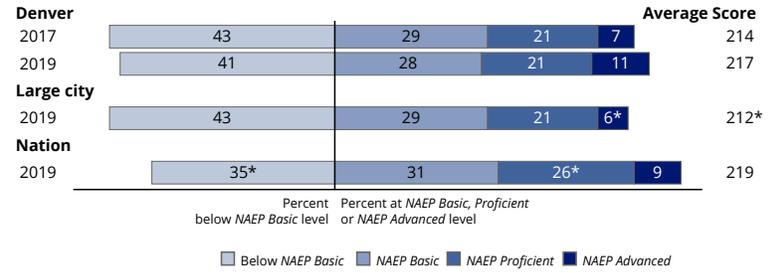


Overall Results

- In 2019, the average score of fourth-grade students in Denver was 217. This was higher than the average score of 212 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Denver in 2019 (217) was not significantly different from their average score in 2017 (214).
- The percentage of students in Denver who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 32 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (29 percent).
- The percentage of students in Denver who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 59 percent in 2019. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2017 (57 percent).

NAEP Achievement-Level Percentages and Average Score Results



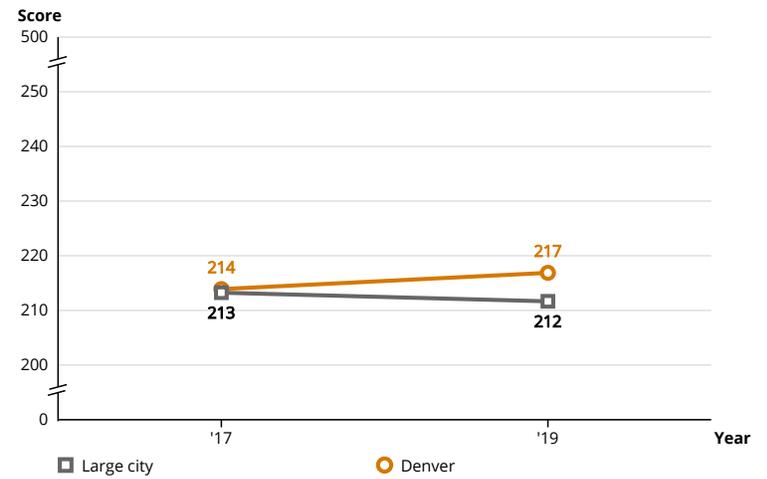

Score Gaps for Student Groups

- In 2019, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (36 points).
- In 2019, Hispanic students had an average score that was 44 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (40 points).
- In 2019, female students in Denver had an average score that was higher than that for male students by 8 points.
- In 2019, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP), had an average score that was 42 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (37 points).
