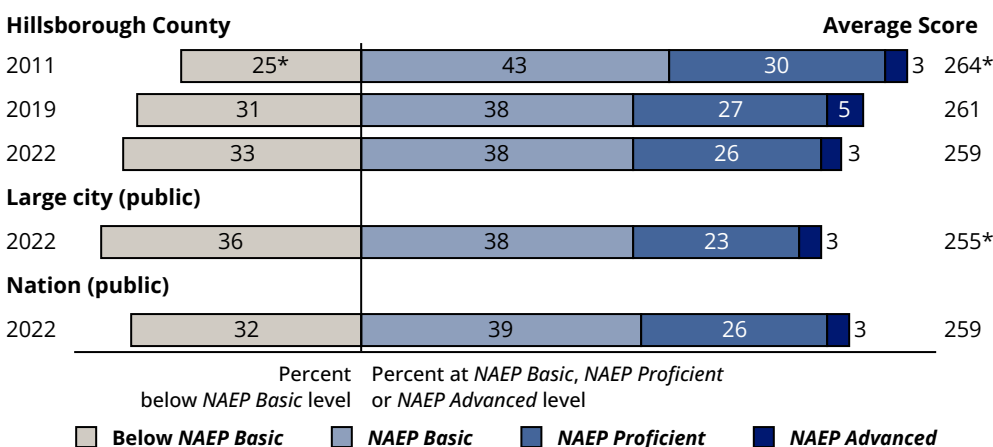


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Hillsborough County was 259. This was higher than the average score of 255 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Hillsborough County in 2022 (259) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (261) and was lower than their average score in 2011 (264).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 29 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (31 percent) and in 2011 (32 percent).
- The percentage of students in Hillsborough County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 67 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (69 percent) and was smaller than that in 2011 (75 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2022. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

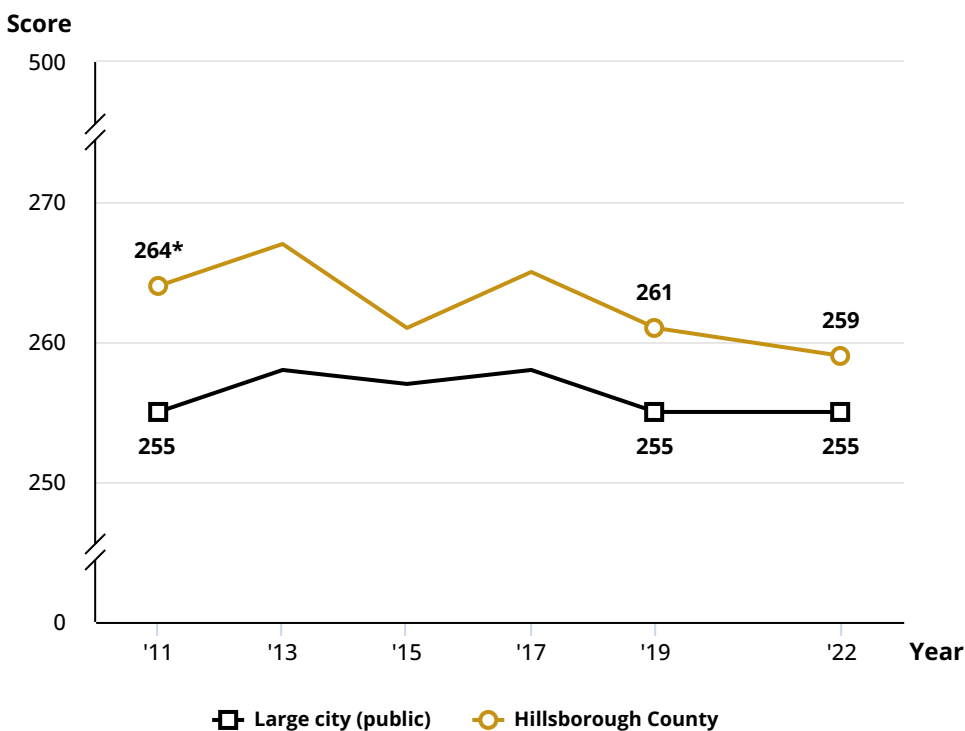

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (29 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 13 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (17 points).
- In 2022, male students in Hillsborough County had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 16 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (22 points).
