
# 2022 READING TRIAL URBAN DISTRICT SNAPSHOT REPORT DETROIT GRADE 8 PUBLIC SCHOOLS

#### **OVERALL RESULTS**

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Detroit was 227. This was lower than the average score of 255 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Detroit in 2022 (227) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (232) and in 2009 (232).
- The percentage of students in Detroit who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 5 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (6 percent) and in 2009 (7 percent).
- The percentage of students in Detroit who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 32 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (39 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2009 (40 percent).



## **SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS**

- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 11 points higher than that for Black students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (0 points).
- In 2022, male students in Detroit had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 10 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP)
  had an average score that was 9 points lower than that for students who were not
  eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (13
  points).
