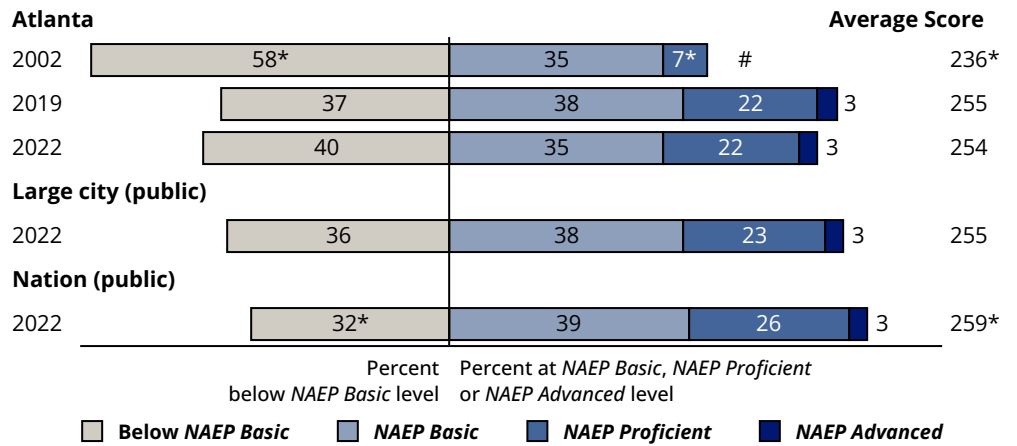


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Atlanta was 254. This was not significantly different from the average score of 255 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Atlanta in 2022 (254) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (255) and was higher than their average score in 2002 (236).
- The percentage of students in Atlanta who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 25 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (25 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (8 percent).
- The percentage of students in Atlanta who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 60 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (63 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (42 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



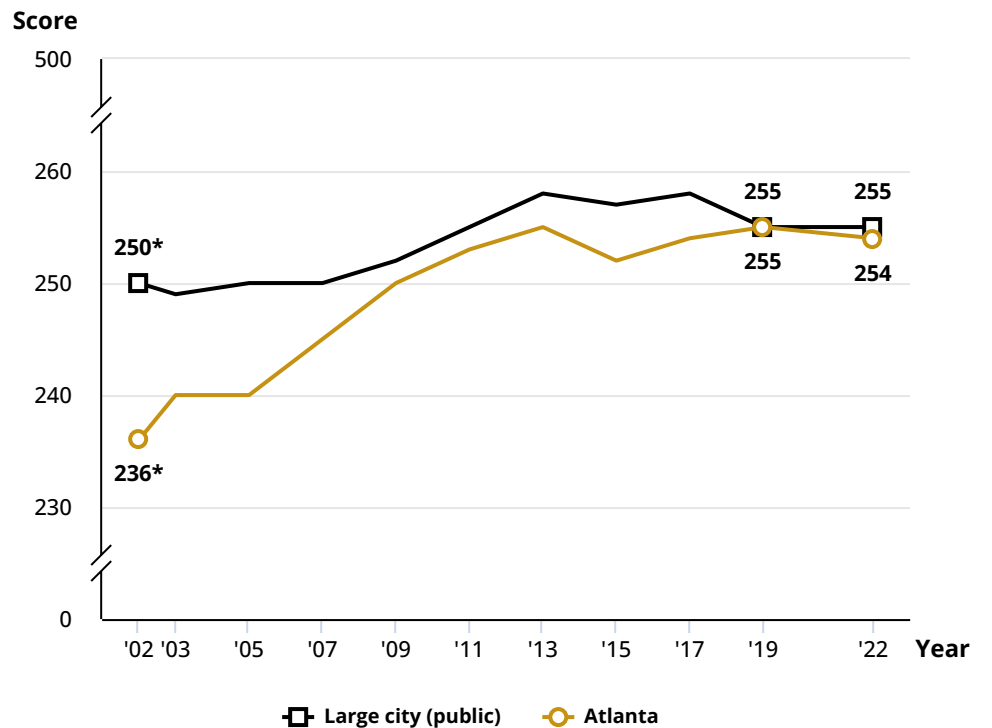

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 53 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (41 points).
- Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in Atlanta had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 8 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (11 points).
