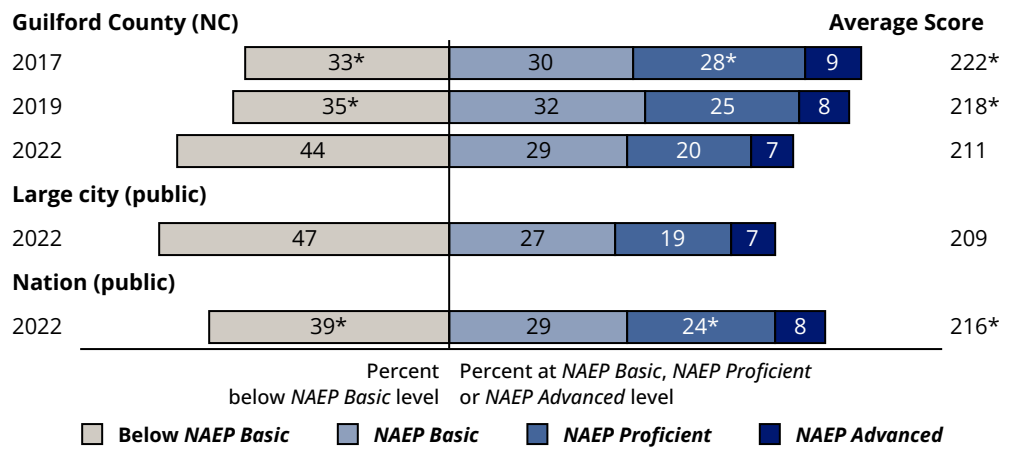


**OVERALL RESULTS**

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Guilford County was 211. This was not significantly different from the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Guilford County in 2022 (211) was lower than their average score in 2019 (218) and in 2017 (222).
- The percentage of students in Guilford County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 27 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (32 percent) and in 2017 (37 percent).
- The percentage of students in Guilford County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 56 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (65 percent) and in 2017 (67 percent).

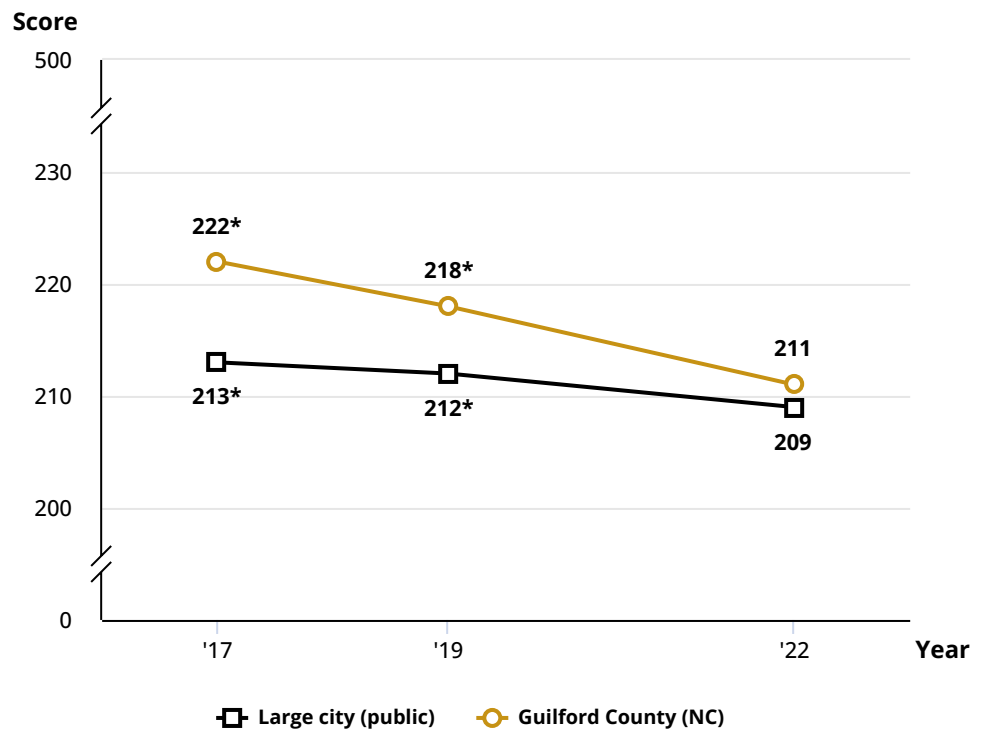

**SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS**

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 32 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (31 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (30 points).
- In 2022, male students in Guilford County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 29 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (25 points).
