
OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Milwaukee was 187. This was lower than the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2022 (187) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (190) and was lower than their average
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 12 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (14 percent) and in 2009 (12 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 33 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (36 percent) and in 2009 (39 percent).



SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 50 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
- In 2022, male students in Milwaukee had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 9 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 33 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (25 points).
