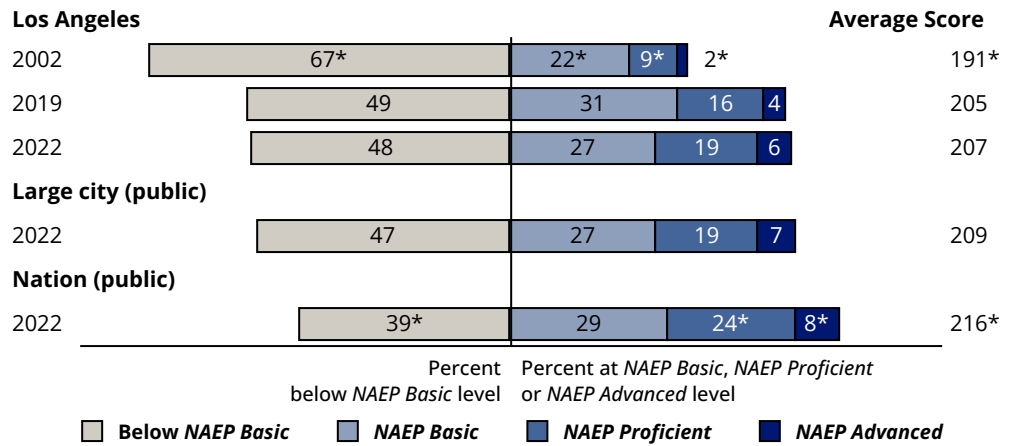


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Los Angeles was 207. This was not significantly different from the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Los Angeles in 2022 (207) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (205) and was higher than their average score in 2002 (191).
- The percentage of students in Los Angeles who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 25 percent in 2022. This percentage was greater than that in 2019 (20 percent) and in 2002 (11 percent).
- The percentage of students in Los Angeles who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 52 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (51 percent) and was greater than that in 2002 (33 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2022. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

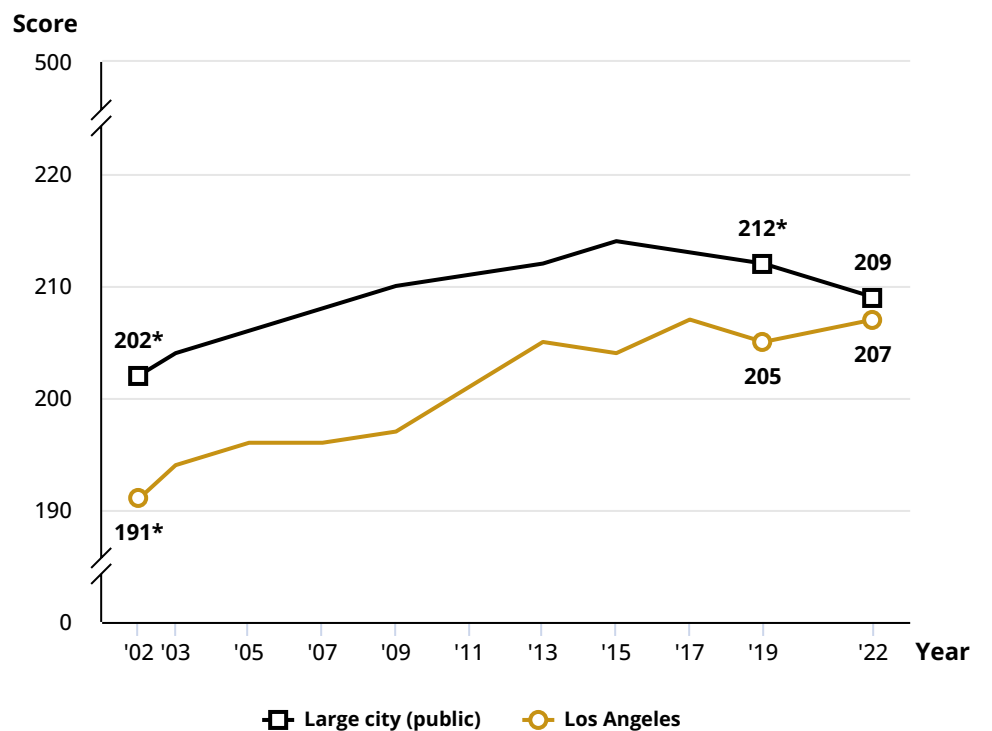

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (37 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 42 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2002 (38 points).
- In 2022, male students in Los Angeles had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was wider than that in 2002 (14 points).
