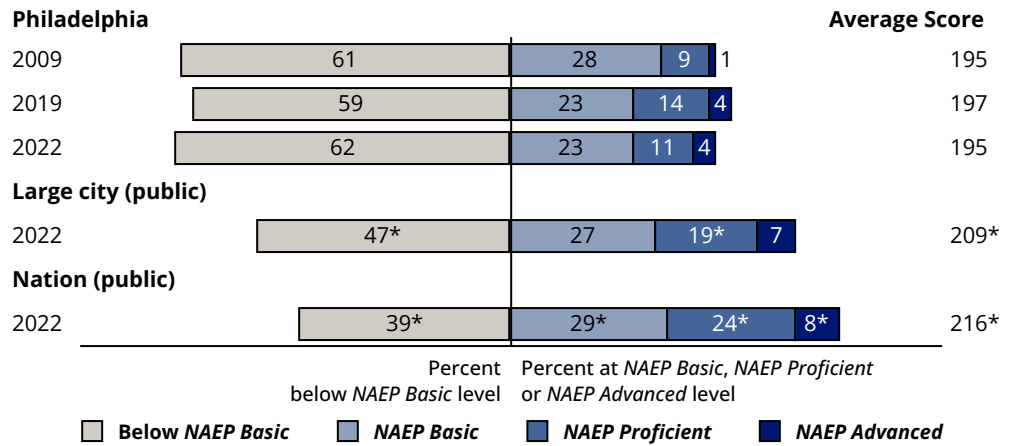


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Philadelphia was 195. This was lower than the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Philadelphia in 2022 (195) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (197) and in 2009 (195).
- The percentage of students in Philadelphia who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 15 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (17 percent) and in 2009 (11 percent).
- The percentage of students in Philadelphia who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 38 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (41 percent) and in 2009 (39 percent).

\* Significantly different ( $p < .05$ ) from the district's results in 2022. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

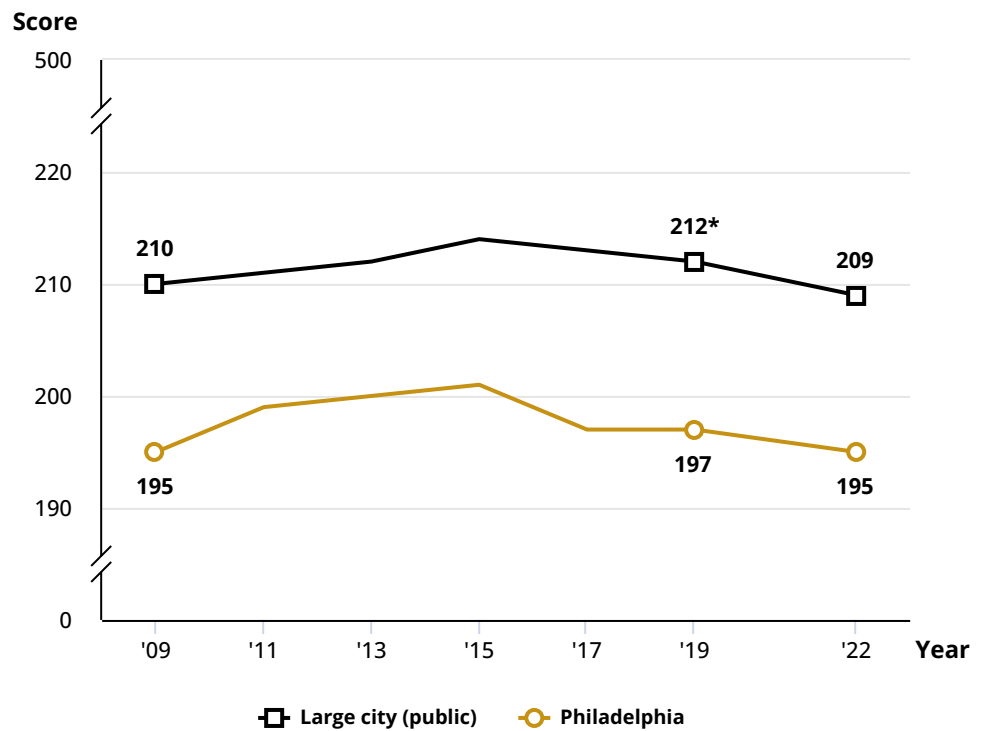

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 39 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (24 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 34 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (28 points).
- In 2022, male students in Philadelphia had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 30 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (21 points).
