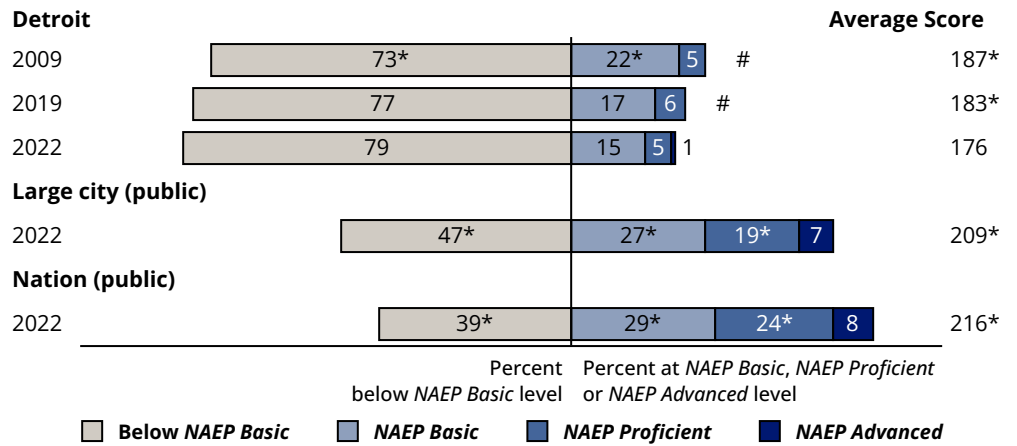


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Detroit was 176. This was lower than the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Detroit in 2022 (176) was lower than their average score in 2019 (183) and in 2009 (187).
- The percentage of students in Detroit who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 5 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (7 percent) and in 2009 (5 percent).
- The percentage of students in Detroit who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 21 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (23 percent) and was smaller than that in 2009 (27 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



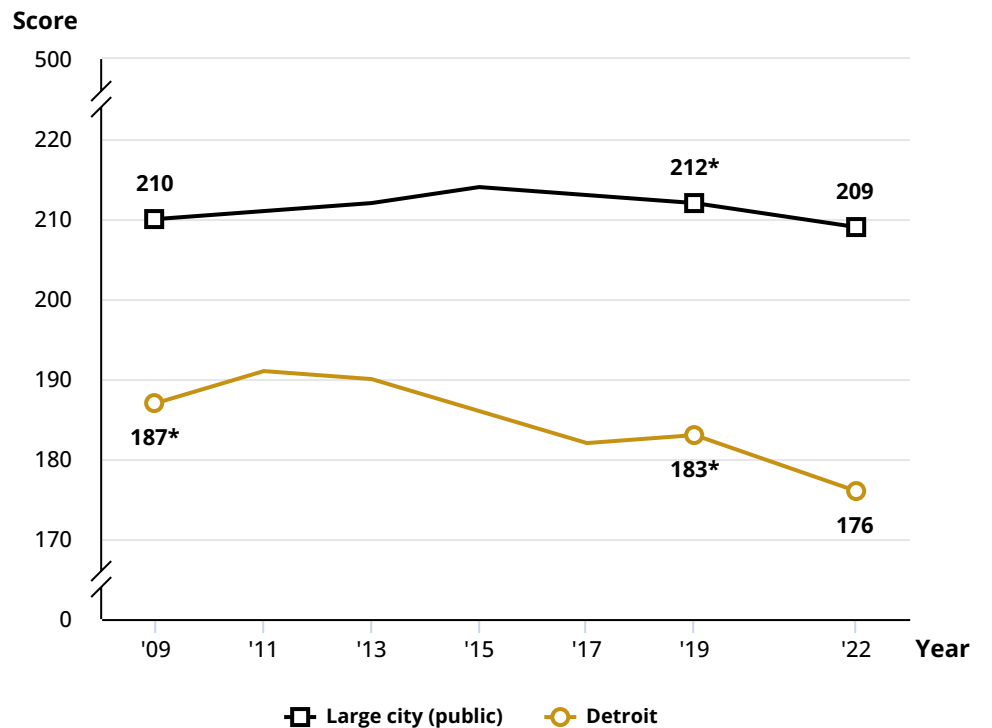

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for Black students.
- In 2022, male students in Detroit had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 9 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was not significantly different from that for students who were not eligible.
