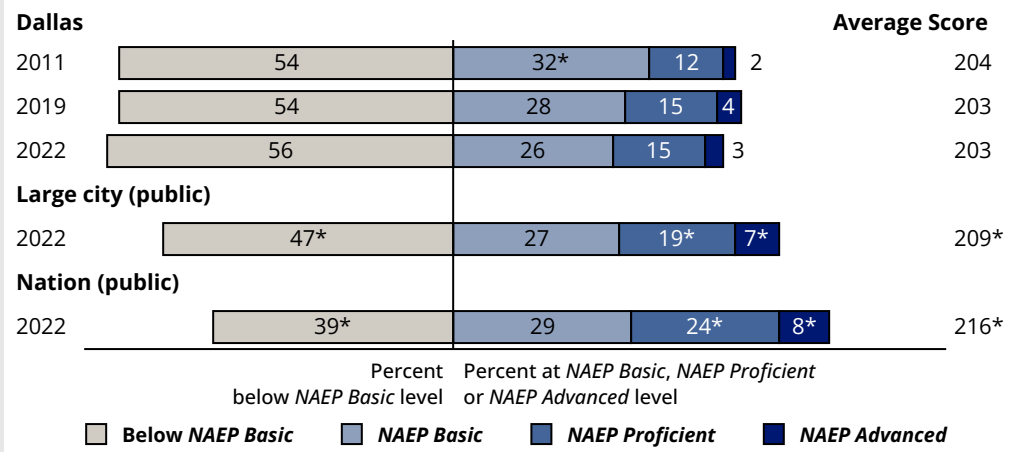


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Dallas was 203. This was lower than the average score of 209 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Dallas in 2022 (203) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (203) and in 2011 (204).
- The percentage of students in Dallas who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 18 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (18 percent) and in 2011 (14 percent).
- The percentage of students in Dallas who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 44 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (46 percent) and in 2011 (46 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2022. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

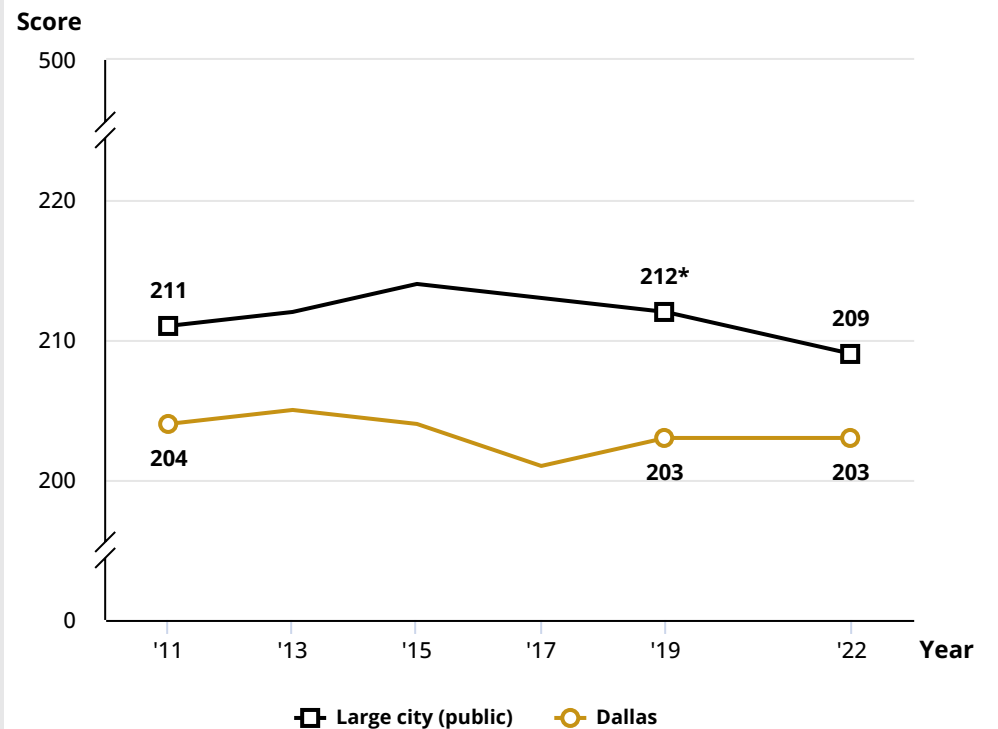

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was not significantly different from that for Black students.
- In 2022, male students in Dallas had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 10 points.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 35 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (24 points).
