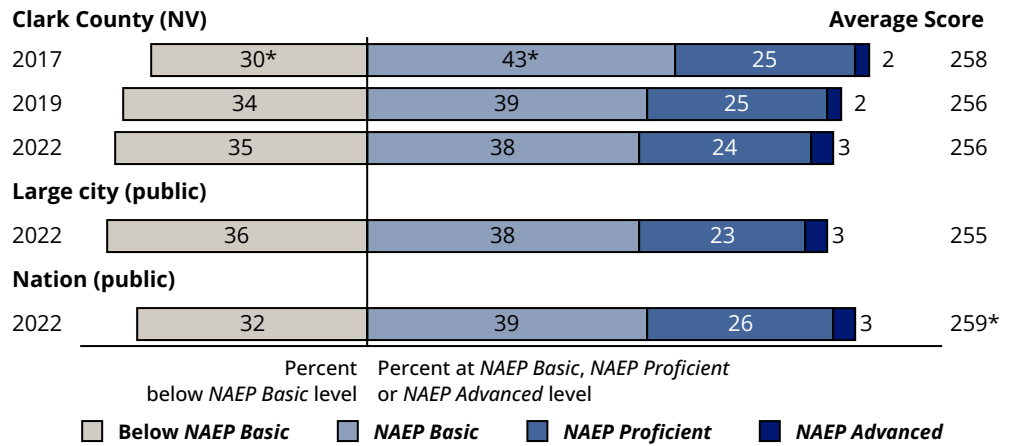


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Clark County was 256. This was not significantly different from the average score of 255 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Clark County in 2022 (256) was not significantly different from their average score in 2019 (256) and in 2017 (258).
- The percentage of students in Clark County who performed at or above the NAEP Proficient level was 27 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (27 percent) and in 2017 (27 percent).
- The percentage of students in Clark County who performed at or above the NAEP Basic level was 65 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (66 percent) and was smaller than that in 2017 (70 percent).

* Significantly different ($p < .05$) from the district's results in 2022. Significance tests were performed using unrounded numbers.

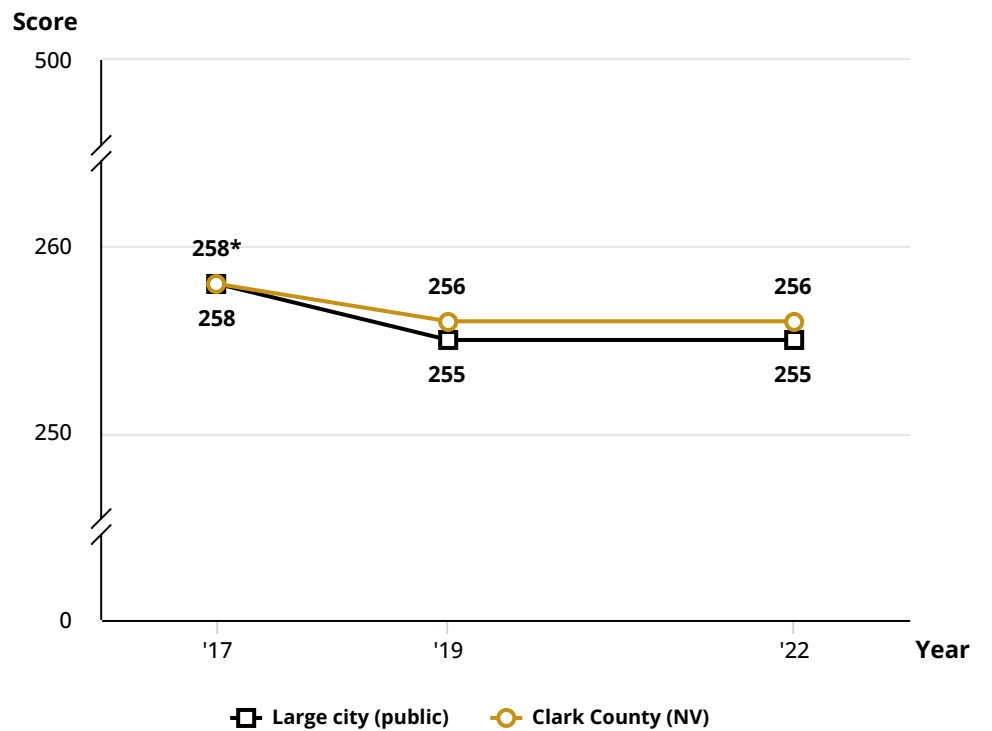

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (26 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 18 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (18 points).
- In 2022, male students in Clark County had an average score that was lower than that for female students by 9 points.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
