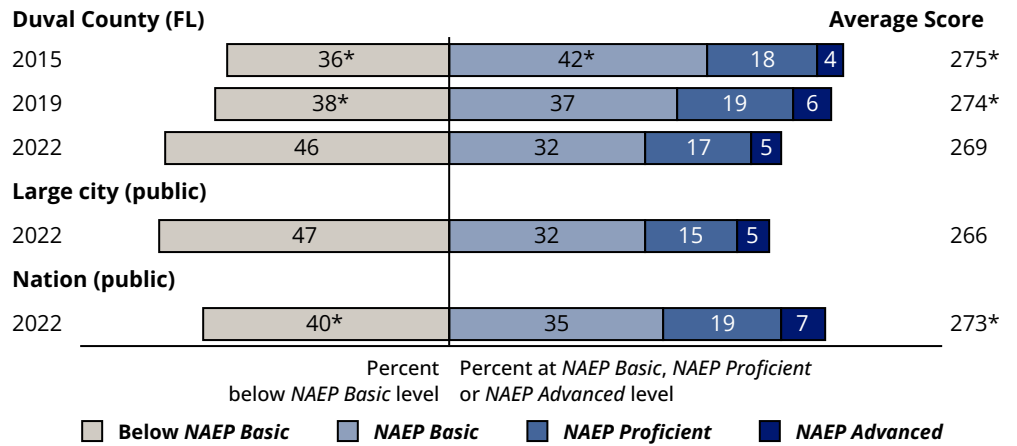


**OVERALL RESULTS**

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Duval County was 269. This was not significantly different from the average score of 266 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Duval County in 2022 (269) was lower than their average score in 2019 (274) and in 2015 (275).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 22 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (25 percent) and in 2015 (22 percent).
- The percentage of students in Duval County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 54 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (62 percent) and in 2015 (64 percent).

**NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS**



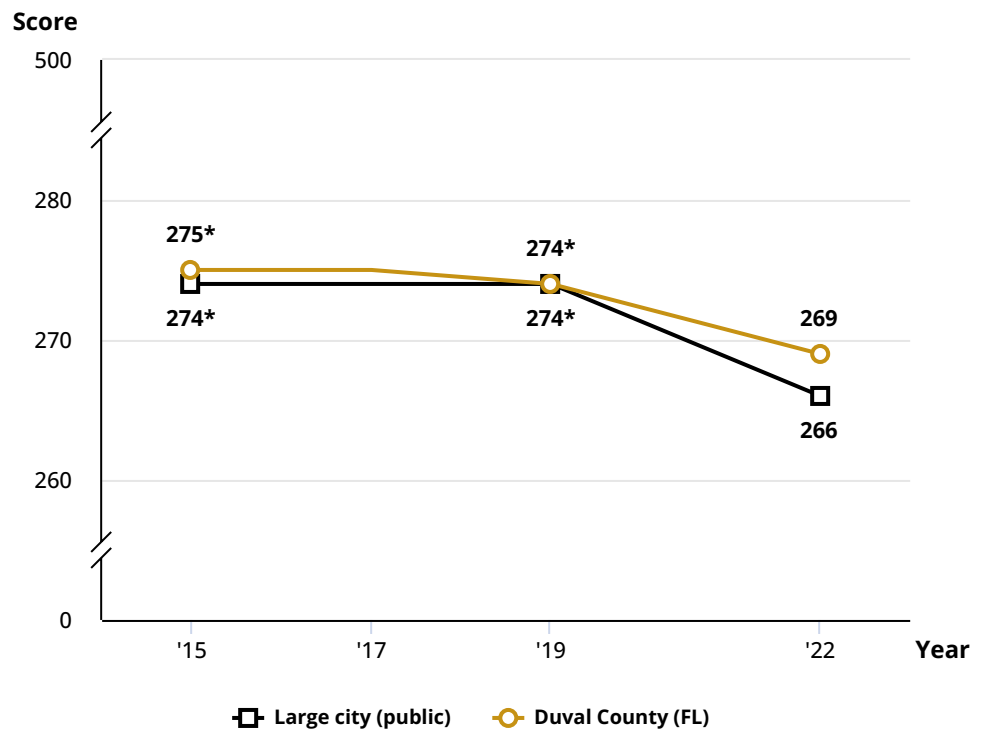

**SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS**

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 25 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (21 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
- In 2022, male students in Duval County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 21 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2015 (18 points).
