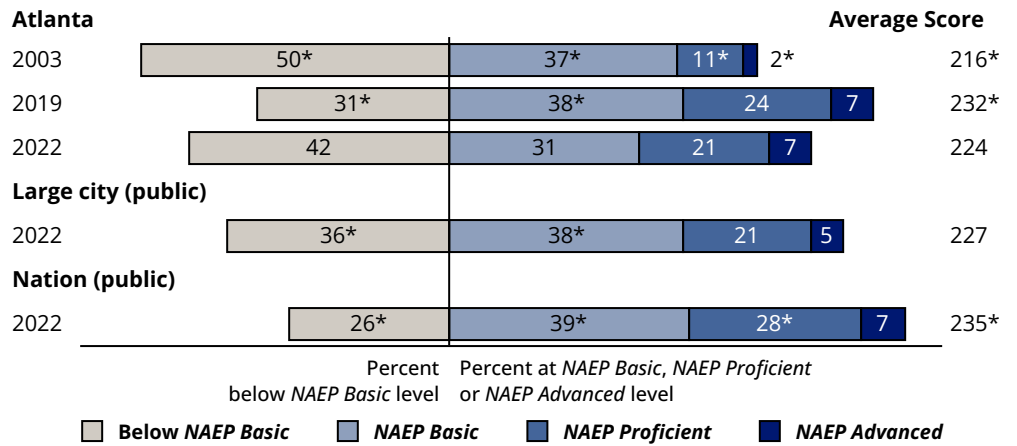


**OVERALL RESULTS**

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Atlanta was 224. This was not significantly different from the average score of 227 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Atlanta in 2022 (224) was lower than their average score in 2019 (232) and was higher than their average score in 2003 (216).
- The percentage of students in Atlanta who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 27 percent in 2022. This percentage was not significantly different from that in 2019 (31 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (13 percent).
- The percentage of students in Atlanta who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 58 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (69 percent) and was greater than that in 2003 (50 percent).

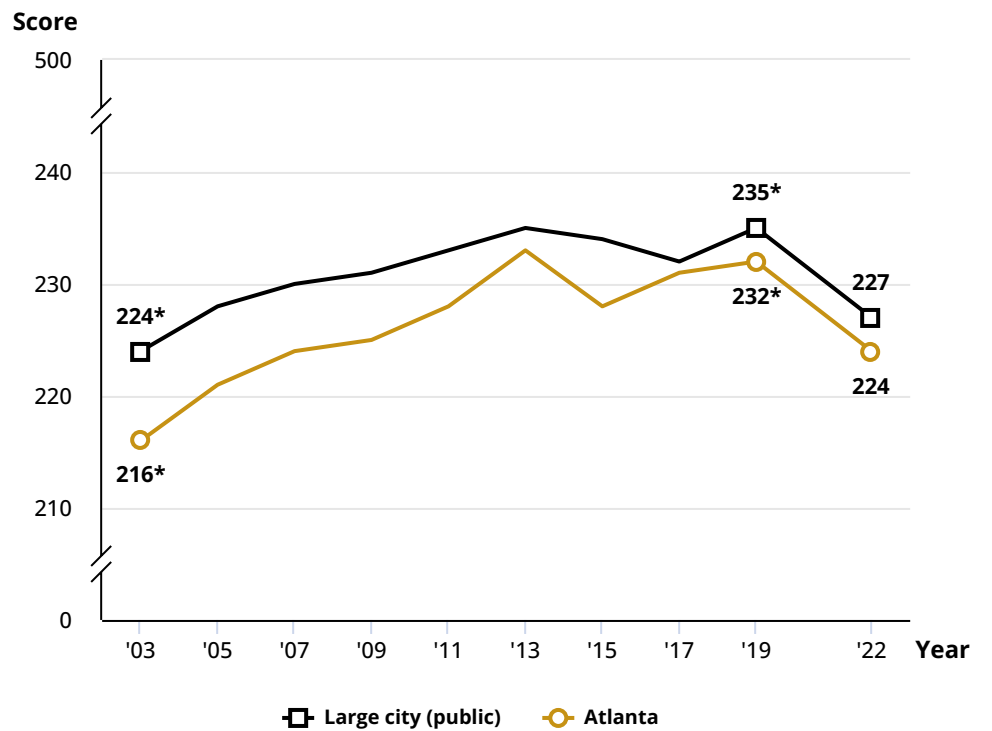

**SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS**

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 53 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (47 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 31 points lower than that for White students. Data are not reported for Hispanic students in 2003, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, male students in Atlanta had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 43 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2003 (34 points).
