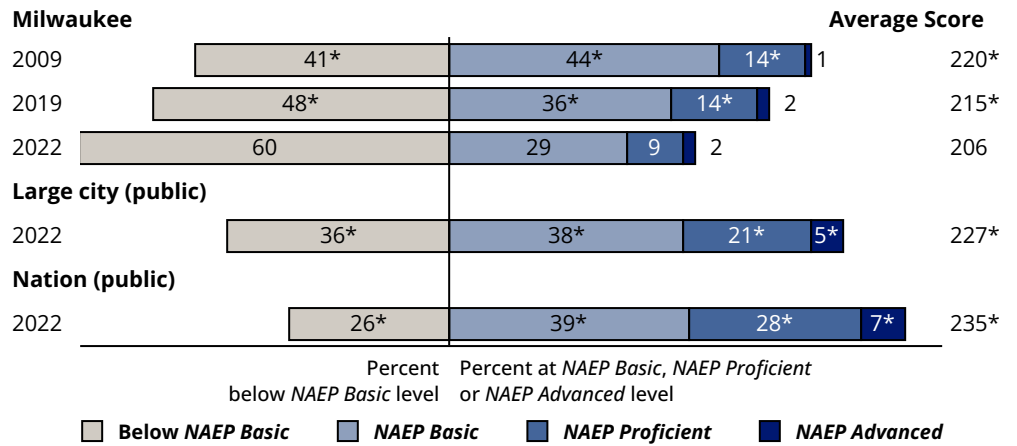


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Milwaukee was 206. This was lower than the average score of 227 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Milwaukee in 2022 (206) was lower than their average score in 2019 (215) and in 2009 (220).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 11 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (17 percent) and was not significantly different from that in 2009 (15 percent).
- The percentage of students in Milwaukee who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 40 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (52 percent) and in 2009 (59 percent).

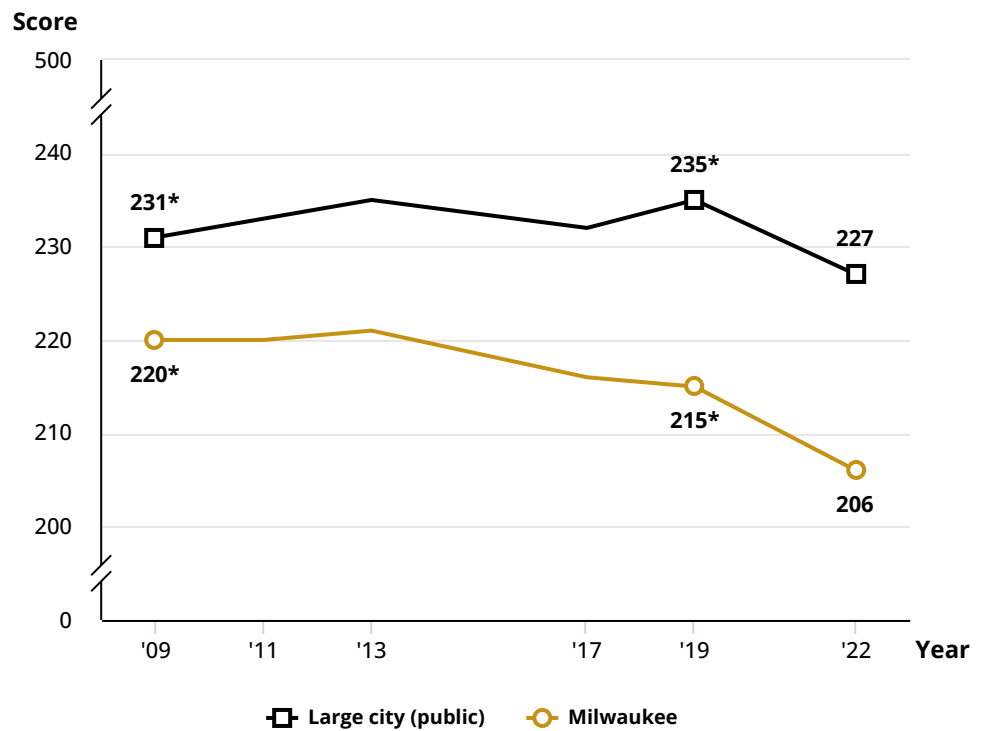

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 44 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (32 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 32 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was wider than that in 2009 (16 points).
- In 2022, male students in Milwaukee had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2009 (18 points).
