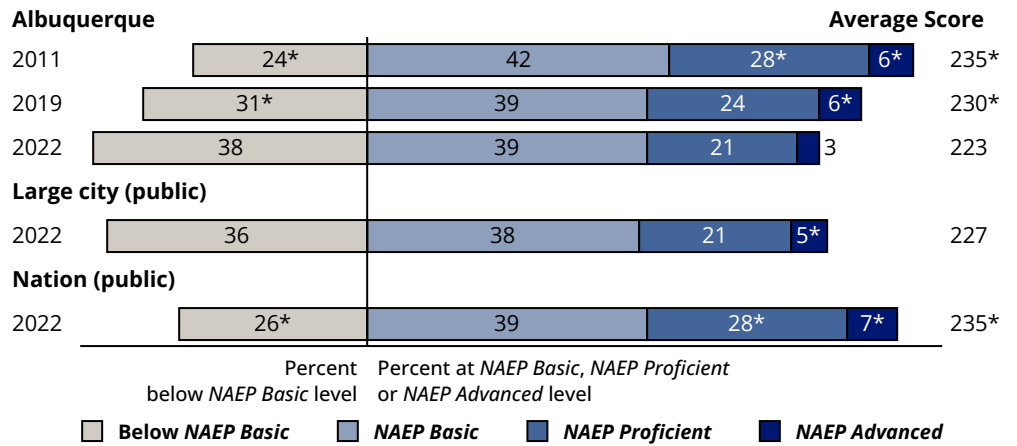


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of fourth-grade students in Albuquerque was 223. This was not significantly different from the average score of 227 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Albuquerque in 2022 (223) was lower than their average score in 2019 (230) and in 2011 (235).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 24 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (30 percent) and in 2011 (34 percent).
- The percentage of students in Albuquerque who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 62 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (69 percent) and in 2011 (76 percent).

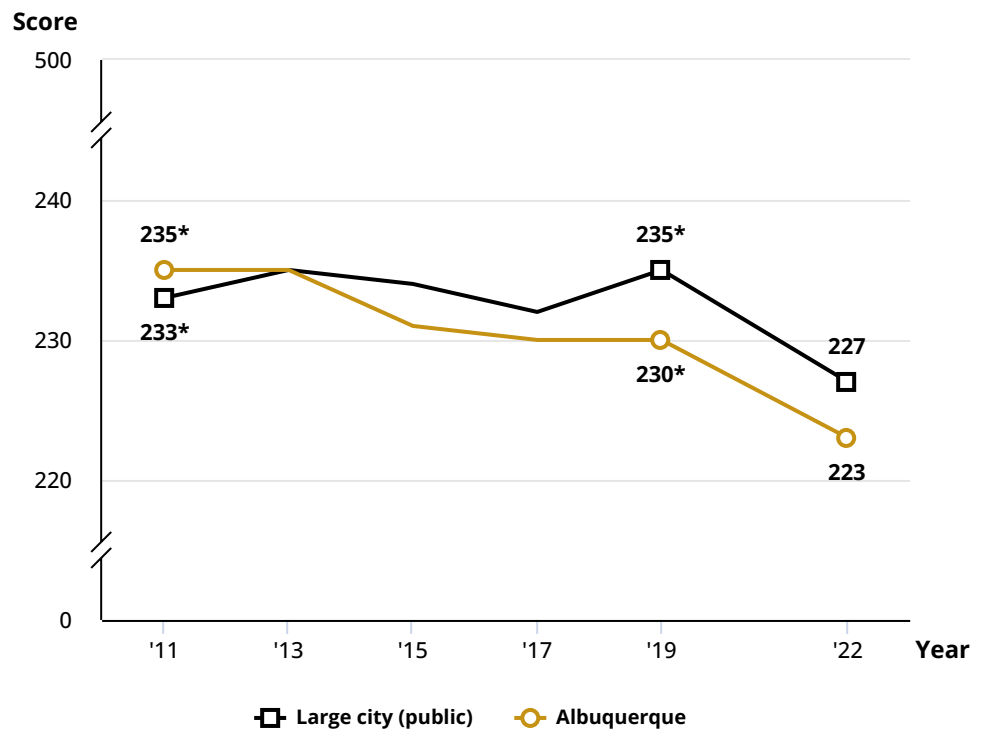

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- Data are not reported for Black students in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 23 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (25 points).
- In 2022, male students in Albuquerque had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- In 2022, students who were eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) had an average score that was 28 points lower than that for students who were not eligible. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2011 (26 points).
