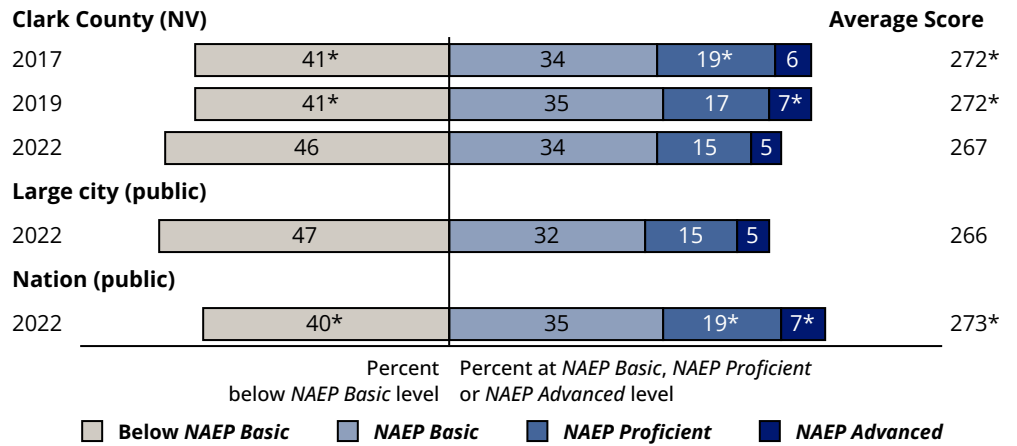


OVERALL RESULTS

- In 2022, the average score of eighth-grade students in Clark County was 267. This was not significantly different from the average score of 266 for students in large cities.
- The average score for students in Clark County in 2022 (267) was lower than their average score in 2019 (272) and in 2017 (272).
- The percentage of students in Clark County who performed at or above the *NAEP Proficient* level was 19 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (24 percent) and in 2017 (25 percent).
- The percentage of students in Clark County who performed at or above the *NAEP Basic* level was 54 percent in 2022. This percentage was smaller than that in 2019 (59 percent) and in 2017 (59 percent).

NAEP ACHIEVEMENT-LEVEL PERCENTAGES AND AVERAGE SCORE RESULTS



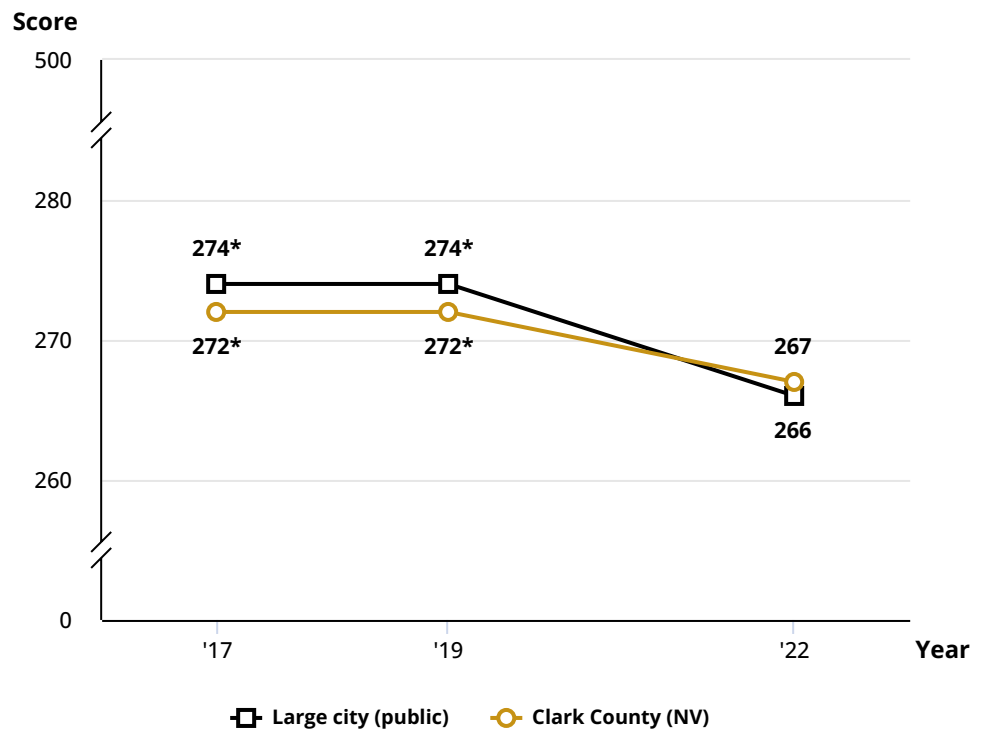

SCORE GAPS FOR STUDENT GROUPS

- In 2022, Black students had an average score that was 43 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (39 points).
- In 2022, Hispanic students had an average score that was 27 points lower than that for White students. This performance gap was not significantly different from that in 2017 (26 points).
- In 2022, male students in Clark County had an average score that was not significantly different from that for female students.
- Data are not reported for students who were not eligible for the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) in 2022, because reporting standards were not met.
